Yes for HOMES!

Lisa and her baby, pictured on page 2, are two of the many local people who have a place to call home because of

the Local Housing Assistance Fund. Since Lisa told her story on screen at our Public Meeting, the ISAAC Housing Task Force has been very active in the effort to make sure there will be funding to prevent and end homelessness for other families like Lisa's.

There's great progress! 1.) The new HOMES Coalition (short for Housing Opportunity Makes Economic Sense) is researching what we need to do to build support county-wide for ending homelessness. 2.) The Public Housing Commission, which runs the Local Housing Assistance Fund, is reporting to the new County Commission on the impressive success of the Fund since the County created it 3 years ago.

Out-county residents are especially needed because homelessness is less visible there–since the shelters and services for people from all parts of the county are in the city. *Please contact ISAAC*.
