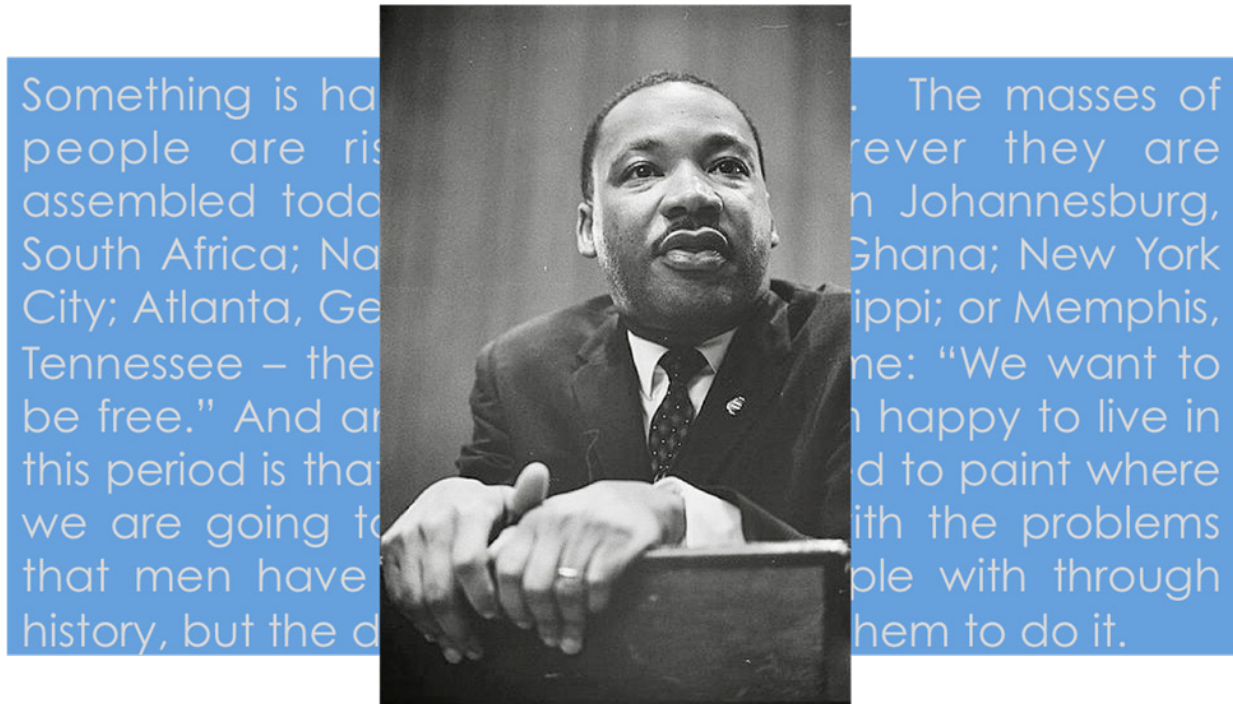


# “I’ve Been to the Mountaintop”
